

MAGISTRATES FIND NO CASE TO ANSWER FOR MAN CHARGED WITH DRINK DRIVE

Magistrates at Sittingbourne found that the prosecution could not establish that Mr Sharp was the driver of a vehicle. Mr Sharp was arrested; he protested his innocence but properly supplied a specimen of breath.

Under cross examination the police officer had to accept that he could not see the person who got into the car, that he could not see the registration number of the vehicle and assumed that a vehicle seen stationary in a car park a few minutes later was the same vehicle seen driving on the road.

In dismissing the case magistrates ordered that the Mr Sharps costs be paid out of central funds
